



 - Determine whether their actions have an impact on these communities or on the advancement of both official languages in Canadian society.






The Official Language Minority Community in Quebec (OLMCQ)





Number of English-Speakers living in Quebec's Administrative Regions





Proportion of English-speakers living in Quebec's Administrative Regions




- CEDEC is a collaborative and innovative economic development agent.

OBJECTIVES

- Strengthen the contribution of Englishspeakers and the OLMCQ to growing and developing Quebec's economy.
- Leverage Quebec's economy to address economic disparities in the OLMCQ.

TEN YEAR TARGETS

- Create or expand 250 businesses or social enterprises.
- Create or fill 1000 jobs.
- Attract \$5M in investment.
- Reduce by 50% the economic disparity in the OLMCQ.
- Expand the number of communities across Quebec benefitting from Collaborative Economic Development.

A Data-focused Approach

CEDEC's Economic & Labour Market Development Applied Research Program (ELMDARP)

This applied OLMCQ research program conducts quantitative and qualitative socio-economic research to inform, support, and improve the participation of English-speakers and the English-Speaking Community of Quebec (ESCQ) in developing the province's economy and participating in its labour market.

- better understand Quebec's economy and the trends that are shaping it.
- establish economic development baselines.
- improve the creation and expansion of businesses, social enterprises, and self-employment.
- strengthen and increase domestic and international trade in goods and services.
- expand employment opportunities, e.g., creating jobs, improving the duration and quality of jobs, and placing OLMCQ members in available jobs.
- prepare OLMCQ members to successfully enter and participate in Quebec's labour market.
- foster economic development by leveraging technology and innovation.
- promote the development and integration of a continuum of life-long employment assistance services (EAS) aligned with Quebec's economic and pool expertise and resources and strengthen collaboration between OLMCQ and majority language communities of Quebec to create benefits from a shared, well-functioning economy.
