## <u>Annual Tax Filer Data, T1 Family File (T1FF)</u> <u>Income Statistics, Statistics Canada</u>

This document accompanies the webinar offered by the Community Data Program which took place on January 18<sup>th</sup>, 2017.

Mandate of the T1 Family File (T1FF):

To supply personal and family income data for different levels of Geography, with a focus on lower level geography. In 2014, T1FF included 34.2 million individuals (26.9 million tax filers plus their dependents). This represented about 9.8 million census families and just under 6 million individuals not in families.

Basic units of analysis for social statistics:

Individuals (IND)

Census families (CF)

Spouses/partners and their children living together who are part of a couple family (with or without children) or a lone-parent family

Economic families (EF) (not available in T1FF) All individuals living together related by blood or marriage http://www.statcan.gc.ca/eng/concepts/definitions/famecon
