Production system issues. Still having problems with Profiles.

TGPs still on the priority list:

- HH TGP of multi-generational households
- HH TGP of households in housing that are unsuitable
- HH TGP of households in subsidized housing

• HH TGP of households in need of major repairs

Ordering this table at standard and custom geos

There are issues with the universe of this table. We should re-order this table with a universe consistent with other tables.

STC has begun work on Working Poor tables

When Working Poor is completed, the next 2016 Census custom tabulations on the priority list:

- CPP-13: Mode of transport to work (6), Income status in 2015 CPP (9), Sex and Age (15), Work Activity During the Reference Year (7), Selected cultural and activity difficulty characteristics (13)
- CPP Table 3: Age groups (8), sex (3), income status in 2010 CPP (7) and selected educational and labour force characteristics (84) for the population 15 years and over in private households
- CPP Table 2d: Detailed language spoken most often at home (269), age groups (10), sex (3), income status in 2010 CPP (7) and knowledge of official languages (5) for the population in private households

2021 Census custom table - priority list

Not much response. Still plenty of time. Default: start out with Target Group Profiles

ACTION: submit TGP requests now - DONE

ACTION: MBM – look into acquiring tables with similar base-year (update 2016 tables? Or use previous base for 2021, as well as 2018 base)

NEED consistent data on the poverty line

Canadian Housing Survey

We received some shell tables for the CHS requests that we submitted and there is a LOT of suppression. Unlikely that we will order these tables.

UPDATE: There was a misunderstanding as to what qualified as publishable data in the shell tables. There is enough usable data to make acquisition of these tables worthwhile and they have been ordered at the Census Division level.

2021 Census – reporting on Gender

Conversation with STC indicated that Gender will be preferred in reporting over Sex at birth. More information to come on gender reporting.

Making arrangements to have a webinar on this subject.

IMDB/IRCC tables

Production on previously acquired IMDB tables will begin soon.

iCARE (service delivery) data tables. Will need to discuss research priorities with National LIP Secretariat. For IMDB want to maximize use of economic outcome/mobility data. Otherwise, get data from IRCC.

Request submitted to IRCC for PR tables. Initial design based on IMDB tables. Temporary residents

Sexual orientation variables from CCHS at smaller geos

Changes to the Labour Force Survey and General Social Survey

- Via the Disaggregated Data Action Plan, working to release more data
- LFS & GSS are slated to have an increase in sample size
- LFS will cover more CSDs (40-45 CSDs will see increase in sample size)
- LFS: Sample increase completed April 2022, with goal of getting CV of 16.6% for unemployment rate of 5% 3-month moving average
- Response rate for LFS has decreased during the pandemic
