# Data acquisition updates

Catalogue additions since last DPAWG meeting (June 3, 2025):

- Dashboard Community Rental Housing Affordability, Version 1.0
- Dataset (Public Listings 2024) Community Rental Housing Affordability, Version 1.0

Note that a webinar to introduce the Rental Housing Affordability Dashboard was given on July 10, 2025.

- Postal Code Conversion File Plus (PCCF+) Version 8C, December 2024
- EIS Employment insurance (EI) beneficiaries, monthly, unadjusted for seasonality

#### Health Indicators

- Food security adult status and household status, moderately food insecure and severely food insecure, by province and health region, CCHS 2023
- Health indicator statistics, for population aged 18 and over, annual estimates by province and health region, CCHS 2023
- Health indicator statistics for youth aged 12 to 17 years, youth reported, CHSCY 2023
- Health indicator statistics for children and youth aged 1 to 17 years, parent reported, CHSCY 2023

Note that StatCan indicated that CD-level data would NOT be possible for the CCHS and CHSCY requests.

**Upcoming Data Acquisitions** 

#### TransUnion 2025Q1

- Mortgage debt, non-mortgage consumer debt, possibly other credit report characteristics.
- TU has indicated that they would like to present their data to members and demonstrate use cases.
- Looking into the possibility of acquiring age bands (18-34, 35-64 and 65+) for debt data.

# **Labour Force Survey**

- Will get 8 tables in catalogue for 35 largest Census Subdivisions. Awaiting cost estimate.
- StatCan looking into feasibility of producing these tables for larger Census Divisions.
- Likely a lot of suppression. Will be produced with Quality Indicators.

#### T1FF Migration Estimates - Table E - 2022-2023

This table should be ready sometime this Fall.

#### IMDB update - CORE tables

- Should be acquired this year. Some delays may occur with the LIP custom geographies.
- Still no decision regarding the IMDB ICARE data.

#### 2021 Census

- Household & Family TGPs @ DA geographies: population in housing requiring major repairs, households in housing that are unsuitable, households in subsidized housing
- Household & Family TGPs @ custom geographies: low-income population (LIM-AT), owner/renter households
- Commuting Flow table @ CD-CSD geographies: <u>similar to this table</u>, but with additional variables added
- 2026 purchase: 2023-base Market Basket Measure tables

### IRCC data

- IRRC contacted us to indicate that they would not be able to fulfill the majority of our request and that we should prioritize certain tables for production.
- The National LIP Secretariat prioritized tables pertaining to Temporary Residents, specifically something that would provide a total of the different types of temporary residents present within a community (e.g., work permit, study permit, Temporary Foreign Worker Program, International Mobility Program).
- We will need to revise our 2026 order and determine priorities for members.

# Integrating Artificial Intelligence into the Community Data Program

### T1FF+ redesign

The redesign will address a few challenges that have been found with the T1FF:

- Partial income of non-filers will be more complete as new imputation method will be in place for non-filer
- Geography will be more precise (not based on postal code as much as possible but rather longitude/latitude)
- Timelines will change when the redesign is completed (faster release, but the 2024 release will be delayed)
- Census family and household information (pending testing) will be available
- Improvement of the derivation of various non-taxable government transfers

Note that **StatCan** is accepting feedback on the redesign from users over the next couple months. No specific timeline was given, but I imagine that the sooner the better.

StatCan is hoping to hear what is missing from the data that would serve users better and have an understanding of what is crucial to users. This could include what variables you would like to see (e.g., break out lone parent families by gender of parent), as well as feedback regarding the format of the tables (e.g., no more merged cells!).

StatCan not open to custom data requests for LFS variables at the Self-contained Labour Area (SLA) level, however...

Work on expanding small area estimation to other labour market indicators and more granular data is ongoing. **StatCan is interested to know what variables would be of interest for further development.** Note that production of estimates using small area estimation techniques is often limited by the availability of an auxiliary data source required by the models.
