

CSDS LEAD CONSORTIUM MEMBER MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

This Memorandum of Agreement (the "Agreement") is made this May 26, 2008.

BETWEEN:

CANADIAN COUNCIL ON SOCIAL DEVELOPMENT,

a corporation incorporated under the laws of Canada, having an office at Coordinates

(herein called "CCSD")

AND

Consortium Lead Organization & Coordinates

(herein called the "Lead Consortium Member" or "Lead")

WHEREAS CCSD is organizing the dissemination of data from Statistics Canada to certain consortia of Canadian municipalities and non-governmental organizations through the Community Social Data Strategy (herein called the "CSDS"); and

WHEREAS the Lead is a member of one of such consortia; and

WHEREAS the Lead wishes to participate in the CSDS and to facilitate the participation of other members of its consortium (the "Consortium") in the CSDS.

NOW THEREFORE in consideration of these premises and for other good and valuable consideration, the sufficiency and receipt of which is hereby mutually acknowledged, CCSD and the Lead agrees as follows.

TERM OF AGREEMENT

This Agreement will be in force from the date of signing until March 31, 2011, unless earlier terminated pursuant to the provisions hereof.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF CCSD

CCSD is the lead organization for the CSDS. CCSD will act as the official contact for all communications regarding the Statistics Canada data products and the licensing arrangements for those products.

CCSD will advise the Lead when the data specified in Schedule A, is posted on the CSDS website. Data will be posted as soon as reasonably practicable following delivery from Statistics Canada. CCSD shall not be liable for any costs, charges, claims, damages or expenses that the Lead Consortium Member or any Consortium member may incur as a result of any delays experienced in delivery of the Statistics Canada for whatever reason.

CCSD will provide ongoing support by telephone and email to the Lead during the term of this Agreement. Site visits may be arranged by mutual agreement. Responsibility for the expenses associated with these visits will be negotiated between CCSD and the Lead Member on a per occasion basis.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE LEAD CONSORTIUM MEMBER

The Lead agrees to abide by the terms of this Agreement and of the Statistics Canada Data Products Sharing Licence in the form of Schedule B (the "Sharing Licence") and the Statistics Canada Consortium End-Use Licence Agreement in the form of Schedule C (the "End-Use Licence").

The Lead shall ensure that all members of its Consortium sign the Sharing Licence and designate one person to act as its licence administrator (the "Licence Administrator") of this Agreement.

The Lead shall provide evidence that all end-users (as defined in the DATA PRODUCTS SHARING LICENSE) within each Consortium member have received the End-Use Licence, before the Consortium will be given access to the data specified in Schedule A.

The Lead shall provide CCSD with the original signed copies of the Sharing Licence for delivery to Statistics Canada. The Lead shall also keep signed copies of these agreements on file.

The Lead shall ensure that it complies with all licensing and other requirements of this Agreement and the Sharing Licence and that any unauthorized use of the data by any of its members is reported to CCSD as soon as possible..

The Lead Consortium Member will act as the lead for the CSDS Consortium in its community and advise CCSD of any requests for membership.

The Lead Consortium Member shall ensure that all information received from CCSD is communicated to the members of its Consortium.

INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY

All training materials and technical documentation used, created or produced under this Agreement remain the property of the originating organization.

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PAYMENT SCHEDULE

Interest on Overdue Accounts

Any amount unpaid on the first day following the due date shall be considered overdue. Overdue accounts will be liable to pay interest calculated and compounded monthly using the previous month's average Bank of Canada rate plus 3 percent.

TERMINATION

This Agreement may be terminated by the Parties upon mutual agreement and upon 90 days written notice to the other.

Where the Lead Consortium Member is found to be in violation of this Agreement, CCSD may terminate this Agreement and the authorization to use the data referenced herein immediately upon written notice to the Lead Member.

In the event of termination of this Agreement with a Lead Consortium Member, CCSD will appoint another member of the Consortium to serve as Lead Consortium Member.

Where the Lead Member so terminated is the Consortium's sole financial contributor, the remaining members of that Consortium will be given 90 days, should they so request of CCSD, in writing, to secure the funding required to continue as a CSDS member Consortium.

The CCSD may withdraw membership and the right to access CSDS data from any Consortium Member found to be violation of the Sharing Licence or the End-Use Licence Agreement. CCSD will inform Statistics Canada of any Consortium member that is no longer authorized to use the data products.

In the event this Agreement is terminated by mutual consent, and where the Consortium is not to continue, the Consortium will be refunded, as follows: (1) 50% of any advance expenditure made by the Consortium for a data product included in the CSDS Data Package that has not yet been provided to the Consortium; and (2) 0% of the applicable Consortium maintenance fee for the year in which the termination took effect and 100% of any fees paid in advance for the years remaining in the contract.

Where a Consortium Member's membership is terminated by mutual consent, that member will be refunded, as follows: (1) 50% of any advance expenditure made by the Member for a data product included in the CSDS Data Package that has not yet been provided to the Member; and (2) 0% of the applicable Consortium maintenance fee for the year in which the termination took effect and 100% of any fees paid by the Member, in advance, for the years remaining in the contract.

In the event of termination, the relevant Licence Administrators must erase all copies of the data products from all workstations, micro-computers or terminals and certify this removal in writing to CCSD and Statistics Canada.

NEW MEMBERS

The Consortium must advise Statistics Canada, in writing, 60 days in advance, of any proposed additions to its membership.

All new members of the Consortium must deliver signed copies of the DATA PRODUCTS SHARING LICENSE, acknowledge receipt of the CONSORTIUM END USE LICENSE AGREEMENT and pay all applicable costs and fees before being given access to the data products and the website.

ADDITIONAL CONSIDERATIONS

The Lead will report to CCSD annually a summary report of the types of uses made of the data received, and products produced from that data.

This Agreement may be executed in one or more counterparts, each of which shall for all purposes be deemed to be an original and all of which shall constitute one and the same instrument.

Each of the parties hereto shall promptly do, make, execute or deliver, or cause to be done, made, executed or delivered, all such further acts, documents and things as the other party hereto may reasonably require from time to time for the purpose of giving effect to this Agreement, and shall use reasonable efforts and take all such steps as may be reasonably within its power to implement to their full extent, the provisions of this Agreement.

This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws in force in the Province of Ontario and the courts of such Province shall have non-exclusive jurisdiction with respect to any dispute arising hereunder. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties with respect to the subject matter herein, and cancels and supersedes any prior understandings and agreements between the parties with respect to the subject matter herein. All additions or modifications to this Agreement must be made in writing and must be signed by both parties. If any provision of this Agreement is held to be invalid or otherwise unenforceable, such provision shall no longer form part of this Agreement. No failure or delay by either party in exercising any right, power or privilege hereunder shall operate as a waiver of such right, power or privilege. The relationship of the parties is that of independent contractors and not that of employer-employee, principal-agent, joint venturer or partner. This Agreement may not be assigned by either party without the prior written consent of the other, and shall ensure to the benefit of and be binding on the parties, their respective successors and permitted assigns.

The Lead shall cause each Consortium member to sign an acknowledgement in the form of Schedule D hereto acknowledging, accepting and agreeing to the rights of CCSD hereunder with respect to such Consortium member. No Consortium member or any of its end users will be given access to the data specified in Schedule A before CCSD receives such signed acknowledgement.
